## **Investment Treaty Disputes**

Likando has appeared before the International Court of Justice (The Hague) and made oral submissions on behalf of the Republic of Mauritius, in the matter between the Republic of Mauritius vs the United Kingdom concerning the decolonization of the Chagos Archipelago islands.

He also represented the Zambian government in an investment arbitration under ICSID rules involving the suit of a foreign national/company, arising alleged breach of Development Agreement (together with stabilization clauses therein). In contention in that arbitration, was the interpretation of taxation laws such as mineral royalty and value added tax, together with the Mines and Mineral Development Act of Zambia.

### Energy, Oil, Gas & Mining

Likando has appeared before the Permanent Court of Arbitration (in London) and represented a client in an arbitration regarding the supply of 1,440,000 metric tonnes of commingled petroleum feedstock. The arbitration was conducted under the Permanent Court of Arbitration Rules 2012 and the UNCITRAL Rules (as revised in 2010). In issue in the said arbitration were complex issues of public procurement, sale of goods, breach and termination of contract.

## Construction, Engineering & Infrastructure

Likando was a former member of the Multi Stakeholders' Group (MSG) which administered the pilot phase of the Construction Sector Transparency Initiative (CoST) in Zambia. He has considerable knowledge in the construction industry and in disclosure requirements required to enhance transparency.

As Attorney General of Zambia, Likando handled various litigation and domestic arbitrations involving construction, engineering and infrastructure disputes. He has also played a critical role of dispute avoidance and resolution, which has saved government millions of dollars in damages and legal cost, but for the dispute avoidance and resolution.

Likando has a passion for human rights and has had handled a variety of matters, including strategic and precedent setting litigation, concerning the promotion and protection of human rights.

He worked with *Interights* in London, an international Non-Governmental Organisation and was the former legal advisor for *Disability Rights Watch*, a human and disability rights civil society organisation dealing with the promotion of the rights of persons with disabilities.

## **Intellectual Property**


